Our Location: We are on the eastern border of Vermont--30 miles NW of Dartmouth College (Hanover, N.H.) and 30 miles SE of Montpelier, Vt. We're located on a high ridge with views of the White Mountains to the east and Green Mountains to the west. Accessible by bus or train at White River Jct., Vt. and plane at Lebanon, N.H. or Burlington, Vt.

Car directions: (from NYC) I 91 north to exit 14; turn left onto Rte. 113 and travel approx. 16 miles, through several small towns. Travel through Vershire, up a long 4 mile hill to top. Proceed past Corinth/Goose Green Rd. on your right to first driveway on right past Wards Garage. (From Boston) I 89 to White River Jct., Vt. then onto I 91 north. I 91 to exit 14, etc.

Permission is given to use painting/riding session pictures in which I may appear. A signed application is usually not necessary for an art program. However, combining painting and horseback riding makes it necessary to bring to your attention a cautionary reminder. It is realized that Black Horse Studio (and Vershire Riding School) does not carry major medical insurance which makes it necessary that your own insurance will cover any mishaps during your riding sessions. With reasonable care, riding, including jumping, is quite safe but we realize accidents can happen and will not hold Black Horse Studio nor Vershire Riding School responsible, assuming normal staff supervision. Under Vermont law, an equine activity sponsor is not liable for an injury to, or death of, a participant in equine activity resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities that are obvious and necessary, pursuant to 12 V.S.A. & 1039 (3).
